

## RECYCLABLE MATERIALS

MATERIAL	WHAT CAN BE RECYCLED	WHAT <u>CAN'T</u> BE RECYCLED	CURBSIDE COMMINGLED?	BOROUGH RECYCLING CENTER?
<b>Glass</b>	Glass food and beverage containers.	Milk-white glass; plate & picture glass; light bulbs; ceramics; crystal; mirrors.	Yes. Discard caps and place in recycling container(s) for curbside pickup by 7 a.m.	Yes. Discard caps. Separate by color into igloos; no blue glass.
<b>Plastic</b>	#1 and #2 plastic (look for the triangular recycle logo on the bottom of the container).	Plastic NOT #1 or #2; plastic without a number; film, tubs, toys, pails; plastic shopping, dry-cleaning and newspaper bags (these may be recycled at most supermarkets).	Yes. Discard caps and place in recycling container(s) for curbside pickup by 7 a.m.	No.
<b>Aluminum and Steel</b>	Beverage and food cans; empty aerosol cans; latex paint cans (paint inside must be dry.)	Aluminum foil; cooking pans (e.g. pie tins); screens, chairs, or other bulk aluminum.	Yes. Place in recycling container(s) for curbside pickup by 7 am.	Yes. Place in designated side ("aluminum" or "steel") of green trailer.
<b>Paper</b>	Newsprint, magazines, junk mail (including window envelopes), telephone books, computer and office paper, catalogs, egg cartons.	Heavy wax or plastic coated paper (juice and milk cartons are okay); wrapping paper with foil.	Yes. Place in recycling container or set aside separately in paper bag or tied with string for curbside pickup by 7 a.m.	Yes. Put in dumpster.
<b>Cardboard</b>	Light weight and corrugated cardboard including pizza boxes, cereal, cracker and other boxes, soda cartons.	Wax or plastic coated cardboard (if you can tear it, it's recyclable).	Yes. Place in recycling container(s) or put alongside container(s) for curbside pickup by 7 a.m.	Yes. Flatten boxes and put in paper dumpster.
<b>Yard Waste</b>	Tree limbs, branches, sticks, leaves.	Grass clippings; limbs in excess of 4 feet in length or 4 inches in diameter.	Yes. Separate curbside collection. Place near curb in recyclable paper bag or trash can by 7 a.m.	No.
<b>Printer Cartridges</b>	Laser, ink-jet, toner cartridges.	Printer ribbons.	No.	No. Collection boxes at Borough Hall.
<b>Cell phones</b>	Cell phones; batteries.		No.	No. Collection boxes at Swarthmore Library or take to any Verizon store.
<b>Rechargeable Batteries</b>	All rechargeable batteries.	Alkaline, lithium, or other non-rechargeable batteries.	No.	No. For nearby drop-off sites see <a href="http://www.rbrc.org">www.rbrc.org</a> or take to HHW collection.
<b>Automotive products</b>	Motor oil, antifreeze, car batteries, tires, scrap metal.	Check with specific drop-off site.	No.	No. For nearby drop-off sites, see <a href="http://www.co.delaware.pa.us/recycle/auto.html">www.co.delaware.pa.us/recycle/auto.html</a>
